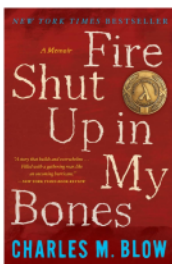


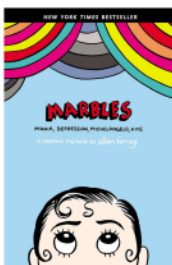
Greedy: Notes from a Bisexual Who Wants Too Much by Jen Winston

Jackson chronicles the ups and downs of growing up confused about his gender. Illuminated by journal entries spanning childhood to adolescence to today, he candidly recalls the challenges and loneliness as he came to terms with his identity as a trans bisexual man.

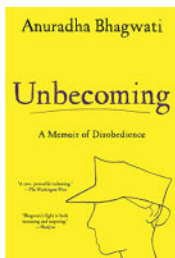

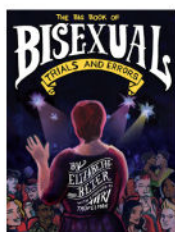

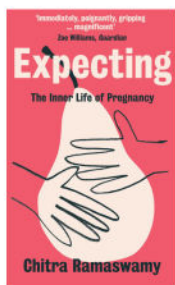
The Big Book of Bisexual Trials & Errors by Elizabeth Beier

Elizabeth Beier's graphic memoir chronicles true-life romantic tales as she breaks up with a long-term boyfriend and navigates a brave new world: dating women.



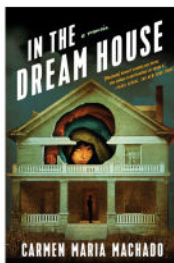
The Fixed Stars by Molly Wizenberg

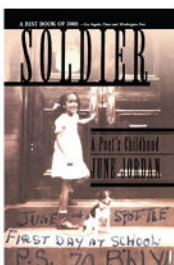
Expecting: The Inner Life of Pregnancy by Chitra Ramaswamy

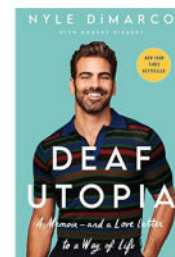
Nonbinary by Genesis P-Orridge
